

Junior Center of Art and Science Seeking Teaching Artists and Science Educators Position: Part-time teaching staff

Position Overview

The Junior Center of Art and Science encourages children's natural wonder and innovation through creative exploration.

Located in the heart of Oakland on the shores of Lake Merritt, the Center is dedicated to delivering programs to the communities of Oakland that support the development of young people who value the arts and sciences within the community. We do so through our interactive learning spaces and through hands-on, exploratory programs including exhibitions, workshops, and classes.

Our programs take place at the Junior Center, in community spaces, and at school sites throughout Oakland and the greater East Bay.

Our community of teaching staff are an essential part of the Junior Center's team. Teaching staff are responsible for teaching arts, science, and arts/science-integrated curriculum to students from ages 1 - 17 years old through our youth, family, and community programs. Our programs take place at the Junior Center, in community venues, and at school sites throughout Oakland and the East Bay.

Duties and Responsibilities

- Teach classes to youth at the Junior Center site in Lake Merritt and/or at school sites
- Design and implement course curriculum with specific attention to developing socially relevant projects

If hired, instructors are required to write a 8 - 9 week curriculum including lesson goals, skills learned, class activities, materials needed, and themes/ ideas explored using the JCAS template.

- Provide guidance and support to students as needed
- Maintain a safe, professional and supportive learning environment for all students
- Arrive prepared and on time for class
- Leave storage spaces and studios clean and tidy after class
- Work collaboratively with the Program Director, administrative staff, and fellow instructors to design and implement program content
- Attend all teaching artist planning meetings and safety training sessions

Desired Qualifications

- Bachelor's degree (major in the visuals arts or sciences preferred)Experience designing and implementing developmentally-based curricula
- Teaching experience in a classroom or community setting –knowledge of classroom

management, common core and/or VAPA/NGSS a plus

- Strong interest in working in a community setting
- Interest in/ability to engage, inspire and challenge youth through the visual arts and/or sciences
- An active art or science practice
- Ability to work well in a collaborative/team setting
- Experience working with a diversity of student populations
- Emotional intelligence: ability to provide compassionate feedback to students and their parents
- Strong people skills and the ability to work well with children, classroom teachers, families, co-workers, and volunteers
- Strong oral and written communication skills; strong interpersonal skills; ability to facilitate group decision-making; ability to handle multiple tasks simultaneously; strong attention to detail.
- Experience working collaboratively
- Able to communicate clearly and efficiently with a variety of audiences
- A strong desire for continued learning/growth in one's teaching practice
- If working with minors, must pass a post-employment criminal background check

Physical Demands and Work Environment

- Must be able to regularly lift up to 25lbs. and climb an 8 ft ladder.
- Must be able to sit and stand for long durations of time.
