Position Overview

The Junior Center of Art and Science encourages children's natural wonder and innovation through creative exploration in the arts and sciences.

Located in the heart of Oakland on the shores of Lake Merritt, the Center is dedicated to delivering hands-on, engaging programs to the communities of Oakland and the greater East Bay Area. We do so through our interactive learning spaces and through exploratory programs including exhibitions, workshops, and classes both on-site and off-site.

Our support staff is essential to the organization's health and success. The Animal Caretaker serves as the first point of contact in our Animal Discovery Room for the community at large including visitors, potential students, and their families. Primary responsibilities include caring for our animals, providing a clean, welcoming learning space in the Animal Discovery Room, engaging visitors, and teaching workshops.

Duties and Responsibilities

The Animal Caretaker will provide care for our animals on Tuesday through Saturdays or Wednesdays to Sundays from 10am - 1pm . The Caretaker will perform routine assignments requiring technical applications including feeding and cleaning out living spaces and observe, report and monitor the health and comfort of a variety of species. Perform animal husbandry and sanitation as prescribed by federal laws and regulations, state law, and JCAS policy.

The Caretaker also serves as the Ambassador and JCAS representative in the Animal Discovery Room - greeting guests, providing a warm and engaging learning environment for visitors, and providing information about JCAS and its programs.

Duties will include:

- Provide care for animals in a humane, safe and sanitary manner using appropriate equipment and established procedures
- Maintain a daily room activity log
- Acquire food on a weekly basis
- Feed and water the animals daily and administer special diets and water according to specified protocols and directions
- Change animal caging as scheduled or needed and clean animal room daily as assigned.
 Breakdown and sanitize animal quarters, service rooms, equipment and hallways as scheduled

- Observe animals for signs of disease and behavioral changes and report observations
- Observe and maintain proper cage environments report and correct any necessary changes
- Attend in house trainings as necessary
- Teach one-day animal discovery workshops as needed.

Desired Qualifications

- Previous related experience with animals.
- Must not be allergic to animals, latex, waste products, bedding or solutions
- Excellent people skills
 - Experience working with a diversity audiences
 - Ability to work well in a collaborative/team setting
- Strong oral and written communication skills; strong interpersonal skills
- Strong attention to detail
- Strong interest in working in a community youth setting
- Interest in art or science practices
- Able to communicate clearly and efficiently with a variety of audiences
- Must pass a post-employment criminal background check
