



Our Year in Review

Through tremendous transition and change, our board and staff have remained committed to delivering quality programs to achieve the Junior Center's mission. In the 2016/2017 year we were able to deliver programs to over **7,000 students** both on-site and across the East Bay through our after-school classes, camps, exhibition program and school partnerships.

With the wonderful support of our funders including the Welte Foundation, the Clorox Foundation, and the McManus Family we provided scholarships to **10 school groups** to receive one of our hands-on workshops in the arts or sciences and to approximately **20 students** to participate in our camps and classes.

This year, we welcomed an Interim Director, Philip Arca to assess organizational needs and steer our transition into the Junior Center's newest chapter. With his help, we've garnered interest from new partners and community members and hired on a new Executive Director.

As a community educator, I am thrilled to be joining the Junior Center during this exciting time of change and growth.

In 1954, the Junior Center was founded on the spirit and passion of 54 individual community members throughout Oakland and the East Bay - including artists, educators, and community leaders. They came together with shared vision to provide a space for young learners to grow in their curiosity and creativity. Over 60 years later, we're looking closely at that founding spirit and asking ourselves, "How can we better serve the young people of Oakland and the greater East Bay?" and "How can we fulfill our potential as an essential community resource?". By examining these questions, we hope to expand the breadth and depth of our impact on the young people and families we reach each year.

Some of our first steps include tripling the amount of programs we offer at our center to include both arts and STEM based programs; and making our programs affordable for all families by implementing a sliding scale model beginning in Fall. This is only the beginning and we invite you to join us as we continue on our journey.
